

ENDgame™ Summary by Emanate Presence

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No advice is given herein.

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In metaphor, who I am has three primary colors, with many gradients in-between: the neuro-me (my human interface), the intermediary me (soul), and the universal Self/non-self. The neuro-me and soul are here to embody the most complete complex of frequencies possible, which I call the Eternal Flame, the Source I Am.

ENDgame: A Self-Customizable Tool of Contemplation, Divination and Meditation assists whole human evolution by communicating across the spectrum of consciousness.

With a daily single roll of dice, ENDgame™ can over time deepen one's feeling of connection and communication with the inner compass (also called the higher self, intuitive feelings, Eternal Flame, Source I Am, etc.) — according to the player's access to higher consciousness, which is non-hierarchical and can be expanded with dedicated practice.

Extensive research had been applied to the development of ENDgame™, drawing on experience, intuitive feelings and multiple sources with assistance from ChatGPT (Open A.I. Assistant). Because information comes from various traditions and systems, there are some overlaps and apparent contradictions e.g. sound correspondences. This is a pioneering game, and experimentation is encouraged. By rolling a die rather than making a personal choice, the meditation can be guided from a more complete perspective of consciousness, and exercise faith. One dodecahedron twelve-sided die (available online or from Emanate Presence) and these information pages are all that's needed to begin. A notebook for journal-keeping, a Text-to-Voice App, e.g., Voice Dream Reader (for customizing audio meditations) and other items are optional.

The Source I Am includes everything, and no-thing can be outside the One Being of consciousness. Within its waves and particles are resonance and dissonance — and in human awareness there are appearances of communion with, or separation from, the Whole. At the extreme end of the spectrum of apparent separation are what some call the dark and evil ones of humanity. The wisdom of Love for Love Itself alone discerns whether justice or mercy best serves. Until this point in the timeline of humankind on earth, few have embodied the Source I Am to the fullest realization of potential — with the evidence of the quality of actions in daily life. At this crossroads of awakening into greater awareness, new possibilities are opening.

Active information is a term used in the ENDgame, and a central piece of the unique approach of this meditation practice which includes receiving active information from higher consciousness. Another unique aspect of the ENDgame as a personal development practice is rolling a die to determine the frequencies and download for the day (more below). Each player may conceive of and approach this differently. For me, it means yielding to the higher intelligence of my being on the way to integrating all my aspects.

An attitude of exploration, experimentation, self-reflection, playfulness, and desire to evolve are helpful when 'playing' the ENDgame. Feel free to contact Emanate Presence with questions, comments, and insights.

The unusual punctuation allows pauses in the audio version, when using a natural voice synthesizer. Feel free to substitute with other words — whatever works best for you.

"Source I Am, guide these dice, as they are rolled, for the Endgame. My focused presence, and heart-centered intention, is to be a constant sun, of confidence, and compassion. Reveal to me, what elements, numbers and body energies, will help balance my whole human experience, today. I release all useless, old information that hinders me, from healing myself. I allow, healing to take place in my body-mind. I request the active information, from a more complete perspective of consciousness, which will deepen my embodiment, of the Eternal Flame, the Source, I Am. I receive all downloads, of active information, from the highest self/non-self, with gratitude."

Suggestions for receiving a download after the roll of the die:

Visualize the color and breathe it in. Listen to the tone online, and reflect on the symbolic meanings over the day. When drawn, look further into the symbolic correspondences as they are very rich and illuminating. Hear the inner voice, and incline towards deepening your connections to the subtle realm. Let go of expectations and mental control, and choose faith instead. Even faith in faith itself is powerful.

One set that can structure a session:

- On a yoga  mat (so can move into stretches afterwards), say or play the consecrated intention and roll the die.
- Read the symbolic correspondences for the number from this page and receive downloads of active information.
- Light a candle and follow the Eternal Flame  meditation or another of your choosing, while breathing the color.
- Do a yoga routine of your choice, with gratitude. Following intuitive feeling, listen to tones or music of the number frequency.
- Throughout the day, look and listen for messages from higher consciousness, and keep a journal .

Integrating Frequencies

Certain sound frequencies are believed to have the ability to bridge between or integrate lower and higher vibrations. These frequencies are often referred to as "sacred frequencies" or "healing frequencies" and used in various spiritual and healing practices. Some examples of such frequencies include:
